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1. Genesis of the Seth Soorajmull Jalan Trust

15th August 1938 opened a new chapter with the formation of the Seth Soorajmull Jalan Trust, a charitable and religious institution which has handed down a legacy of humanitarian services especially in the field of women's education and development. The Trust was formed under the leadership of Seth MohanlalJalan and other prominent members of the society.

The Trust was instrumental in establishing a large number of schools, libraries and reading rooms and Colleges in West Bengal and other parts of India.

History of the College

Seth Soorajmull Jalan Girls' College owes its existence to the great industrialist of Bengal, late Shri MohanlalJalan, the founder president of the College. He was a noted industrialist, benevolent social worker and an enthusiastic promoter of Women's Education in Kolkata and in other parts of India. He made his revered father's dream a reality and the College owes its existence to his benevolent vision. Seth Soorajmull Jalan Girls' College had a very modest beginning with a hand full of students at Seth Soorajmull Jalan School at 186, Chittaranjan Avenue, Kolkata - 700 007 on 2nd August, 1954. Today, under the able guidance of the present President of the College, Shri Tularam Jalan, the College has extended education to girls of all communities. The College has earned a notable cosmopolitan character today and has been totally successful in being one of the notable girls' colleges in North Kolkata where the medium of instruction is English.

The College has completed its sixty-third year. In our pursuit of excellence, the College is assessed accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The first accreditation cycle was held in 2006 and the Second Cycle in 2016. **NAAC** is an autonomous body established by the University Grants Commission (UGC) of India to assess and accredit institutions of higher education in the country. It is an outcome of the recommendations of the National Policy on Education (1986) that laid special emphasis on upholding the quality of higher education in India. We are indeed proud to declare that this esteemed body has evaluated the all-round development of the College and has awarded the College B+ grade.

The College has seriously taken note of the various recommendations of the UGC Guidelines for the further development of the College. As an organized effort for self-improvement, the College has established the **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)**, which is a body that helps in defining and guiding sustenance activity.


Mission & Goals

Computer Course

The College provides Computer Courses to the students of:

B. A. 1st Year: Fundamental Windows 98 & MS - EXCEL, MS-WORD & PAGEMAKER. A Certificate of Merit is given to the students who pass the theory & practical examination conducted by the College.

Information Technology is the compulsory subject for B.Com Second Year students as per the syllabus of Calcutta University.

iii) Procedure for Admission

Admission to the College is provisional till the registration is confirmed by University of Calcutta.

Admission procedure commences immediately after the publication of +2 Board results & closes on such date as notified by the College authorities.

Students seeking admission to B.A. / B.Com. Honours will be admitted on the basis of -Merit List after submission of application forms Online as per the". Schedule given by the College Website: www.ssjalangirlscollege.org. The Students seeking admission in the Genaral Stream BA/B.Com will also have to apply online.

Students seeking admission to the College must note the following:

- a) Applications for admission to First Year B.A. / B.Com course 2017-2018 will be online from the day of declaration of the Class XII / Uchcha Madhyamik / Higher Secondary (West Bengal Board) results.
- b) Admission to BA & B.Com Honours will be on the basis of merit list. Admission / Counseling dates of the applicants will be notified in the Website and College Notice Board.
- c) Selected applicants must attach one recent photograph, one copy photograph of the guardian, age proof certificate and attested Xerox copies of Admit Cards & Mark Sheets of the previous qualifying examination with the Admission Form at the time of taking admission on payment of requisite fees to the Bank.
- d) Students coming from other State Boards are required to pay a Migration Fee of Rs. 100 for admission to B.A./B.COM. Ist Year& furnish the office with the information regarding particulars specified in the prescribed form to be had from the College office.
- e) The Students from other States have to submit original Migration certificate.

iv) Rules for Payment of Fees

- a) Fees is to be paid in advance on quarterly basis either by cheque only. If a student fails to deposit her fees for two consecutive quarters, her name will be struck off from the register and re-admission will be allowed at the absolute discretion of the Teacher-in-Charge on payment of the usual re-admission fee equivalent to One Month Tuition fee.
- b) If fees not paid within the due date, a late fine of ₹.100 per quarter will be charged and is to be included with next quarter fee.
- c) Rs.100 will be charged for every dishonoured cheque.
- d) The HDFC Bank Ltd.57 Mahatma Gandhi Road.Kolkata-700009, College Street Branch, is authorized to collect the fees. Students are directed to get their fee books from the College office and deposit the amount with the Bank during the banking hours on the dates mentioned in the fee book or through ECS.
- e) A Fee Book is supplied to each student either on admission or on promotion to the higher class. All fees should be paid through the Fee Books and students must preserve their Fee Books carefully as they will have to produce them whenever required. A duplicate copy may be supplied with Charge of ₹. 10.
- f) Fees once paid cannot be refunded.
- g) Library and other deposits cannot be refunded except at the end of the session.
- h) Before the start of academic session in July every year, the students have to take admission to the 2nd year & 3rd year classes respectively. The students should checkthe notice given in the College website.

• Full Free, Half Free Studentship for 10%meritorious but financially weak students is given. Students who wish to avail this facility should apply within 1st to 15th September with necessary documents.

v) Academic Calendar

The College encourages every teacher to make a detailed lesson plan to ensure effective class teaching and proper management of time. Every year, before the commencement of classes each department earmarks portions of the syllabus for every teacher. A detailed lesson plan is prepared and academic calendar for each department is published.

The syllabus is normally followed as stated in the teaching plan. If there is any modification, the change is communicated to the students. Every department tries to, co-ordinate the recommended lectures per topic and the number of teaching days available in an academic year. Extra classes are arranged according to necessity.

vi) Attendance:

Regular and punctual attendance is compulsory for every student of the College

As per University of Calcutta regulation, a student will be considered:

- (i) **Non-collegiate** if her attendance in any subject / group of subjects falls short of 75% but not below 60%. Candidates declared Non-collegiate may be allowed to fill in applications forms for examination on payment of requisite Non-collegiate fees.
- (ii) **Dis-collegiate** acandidate who has not attended at least 60% of lectures delivered / practical classes held in any subject/ group of subjects shall be considered as "Discollegiate" and shall be debarred from appearing in any examination. College will abide by the University rules.

vii) Rules for eligibility for University Examination:

- (a) Eligibility shall be decided by the College authority strictly in accordance with the regulations laid down for the purpose.
- (b) Absence from Mid Term Examination and Test will not be condoned.
- (c) Poor performance of Honours students in the Mid-term Examination shall result in their being transferred to the General Course.
- (d) Selection of students for being sent up for University Examinations will be made strictly in accordance with the rules laid down by the College (under directions of the University) as adopted by its Teachers' Council.
- (e) The decision made on the basis of and in accordance with the relevant rules in force shall be final and binding.
- (f) There shall not be any revision or re-consideration except in case where an error of any kind has been detected.
- (g) Exceptional cases will be decided in the promotion meeting and the decision of the Teaching Body will be final.
- (h) Any attempt on the part of the students and / or their parents or guardians to bring any kind of influence or pressure for promotion or for sending up their wards; who have failed to qualify themselves for the same under the rules; will not only be of an effect but will tend to prejudice their cases. However, when a genuine error is detected, the case should be brought to the notice of Teacher-in-Charge / Secretary for enquiry and rectification
- (i) (Strict measure shall be taken against students found using "Unfair Means".
- **viii)** Computerized progress reports showing the marks obtained in the Mid Term tests and Test Examination are issued to the students of all the streams

5. Infrastructure & facilities provided by the College Students from the very date of the session, viz.,

- 1: **Library:** The College has a well-equippedcomputerized library consisting of more than 28,777 books covering all subjects, journals, periodicals, magazines, newspapers adequately to meet the requirement of both students and teachers. The Inflib-net facility is also available. Students can search books through user-terminal and Open Access to library stacks with OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue).
- 2. **Book Bank**: Book Bank facilities are available to the students.
- 3. **Reading Room**: A large well equipped reading room for students and separate reading room for teachers are there.
- 4. Class Room: ICT facilitated smart classrooms are available
- 5. **Departmental Seminar Library**: Each Honours Department possesses a seminar library to provide students with text and reference books in addition to the facility provided by the main library.
- 6. **UGC Network Resource Centre**: Funded by UGC, it aims to provide students with internet facilities.
- 7. **Students' Counseling Desk**: Student friendly teachers are always available to sort out specific academic problems as well as for personal & social problems.
 - 8. **Personality Test**: Personality Test of the students are arranged by the College through Indian Institute of Psychometry:
 - 9. **Career Guidance**: The College adopts several measures to secure bright future for the students. Teachers involved in the counseling cell provide students with Information through different papers like Employment News and brochures sent by different organizations. From time to time, entrepreneurship development programmes and different other training programmes are organized for the benefit of the students.
 - 10.**Grievance Redressal Cell**: A grievance redressal cell with complaint box has been set up to look into all types of grievances of students and accept suggestions from teachers, students, guardians & staff for better functioning of the College.
 - 11. **Legal Literacy Club**: To create awareness amongst the students regarding their legal rights.
 - 12. **Aquaguard**: Purified drinking water is supplied from aquaguard in each floor and Water Cooler with proper sanitation.

- 13. **Medical Facility**: A separate Medical Room with provision of first aid is made available to the students. The medical practitioner is attached with the College for any kind of medical problems of the student. The College is associated with The Students' Health Home where a student can do health check —up by paying Rupees 10 per year.
- 14. **Fire Extinguisher**: A few fire extinguishers have been installed on each floor of the college premise as a precautionary measure to deal with any probable calamity caused by fire.
- 15. College Magazine & Wall Magazine: To encourage original thought & Expression among students and to make them aware of the recent events of the outside world, the College publishes a printed magazine of its own every year. Also there is provision for wall magazine published by the students.
- 16. **Co and Extra. Curricular Activities**: It covers Inter & Intra-College competitions in Debate, Drama, Elocution, Music, Drawing, Short story, College social, Freshers' Welcome and Farewell Programme are held regularly. Extension programmes like environmental awareness, medical camp, blood donation camp, thalassemia screening camp, AIDS awareness are taken care of every year.
- 17. **Games & Sports**: It opens scope to express the students' ability in sports. Students take part in various Inter-College competitions. Annual sports is held every year.
- 18. **Students'Association**: Every year several students are selected as class representatives. All class representatives together form the students' association. Students' views are expressed through this platform and it works in unison with the teaching and non-teaching staff.
- .19**Students' enclave**: It consists of: a) Common room with Table-Tennis Board and other indoor games like badminton, carom boards, etc where the students can spend their leisure time, b) Canteen, the students' food corner.
- 20. **Yoga Centre**: In order to train the students in Yoga & Gymnastics, the College has a center with trained instructor.
- 21. **Academic Tour**: Academic Tours are arranged by several departments as part of their education.
- 22. **Facilities for Physically Challenged**: Self-operative wheel chair for physically challenged is provided and lift/elevator is available.
- 23. **Orientation Programme**: Orientation Programme for the Freshers on their first day of the College is held.
 - 24. **Incinerator machine**: Facility of Incinerator and vending machine for sanitary purposes.

6. Some unique features of the College

- 1. Remedial classes for academic redressal of backward students and slow learners.
- 2. Additional care and attention for deserving students.

- 3. Regular tutorial classes for intensive studies.
- 4. Parent Teacher Meet once a year for better understanding of students' progress. In addition, parents are called for intimidation about the performance of the students in Mid-Term examinations and Test examinations.
- 5. Evaluation of teachers, teaching methods by the students.
- 6. Special lectures by persons of eminence arranged for students.
- 7. UGC sponsored seminars, departmental seminars and special seminars conducted by NSS.
- 8. Active participation of students in civic awareness programme.
- 9. Picnic and Saraswati Puja are organized every year.
- 10. Industry Visit for Commerce Students and audio-visual screenings for better teaching-learning process are held.
- 11. There is scope for prizes, scholarships like kanyasree, Scheme for Minority Students Scholarship, Vivekananda Academy, for successful and meritorious students.
- 12. Institutional Membership of Students Health Home, Kolkata: The College has an institutional membership of the Students Health Home located at 142/2, A.J.C. Bose Road, Kolkata. Medical facilities to students such as free consultation at their polyclinic, medicines, vaccination, pathological tests, X-ray; E.C.G. E.E.G., Endoscopy and other tests, surgery etc. and the treatment at their hospital are provided at a very nominal rate.
- 13. The College is a center for the immunization programmeorganized by the Kolkata Municipal Corporation.
- 14. NSS: The College runs NSS Wing under University of Calcutta. The College is the Headquarter of District III.

7. Discipline and Conduct of the College

The College insists on strict discipline and students are expected to follow the rules rigidly. Admission in every case implies an undertaking on the part of the students to conform to the rules and discipline of the College. As per UGC guidelines, the college has an Anti – Ragging Cell. Anti is prohibited and anyone found guilty is liable to be punished.

- 1. Mobile Phone: Use of Mobile phone is banned in the class room and passages adjoining class rooms. Any violation of this may attract a fine of Rs: 500 and forfeiture of the phone till such time the fine is paid.
- 2. **Late Attendance**: Late attendance is not acceptable. All the teachers have been authorized to disallow a student from attending a class if the student comes late.
- 3. Identity Card: Identity Card must be carried by students at all time.
- 4. Gross misconduct or breach of College discipline, copying or communicating with other students during examination and impersonation at Roll call will be severely dealt with. A

student will not be **Promoted** or **Sent up** if she is found using unfair means in the Examination Hall..

- 5. Disfiguring of walls, furniture or any of the properties of the College with writing or in any other manner will be viewed with grave concern and may result in imposition of fine, suspension from classes or dismissal or expulsion from the College.
- 6. Students should not leave the class without the permission of the teacher.

7 Attendance at the College Examination is compulsory for all students. Promotion or sending up of students for Calcutta University Examinations is determined on

the basis of the total marks secured in the different examinations. Medical Certificate is no substitute for attendance.

- 8. No student shall leave the College at any time during the working hours without the permission of the Teacher-in-Charge. Permission will be granted to the student according to the discretion of the Authority.
 - 9. Students who remain absent from the College for a month without taking prior permission, will have their names struck off from the Register.
- 10. Attendance at all functions of the College whether on working days or on holidays is compulsory and absence from the same without valid reasons will be strictly dealt with.
 - 11. Change of address and telephone numbers must always be notified in writing to the Teacher-in-Charge.
 - 12. It is compulsory for the students to attend Assembly and also Independence Day, Sports Day and Annual Functions.
 - 13. Student must not gather in front of class room before classes are over, nor should they loiter in the corridor when classes are being held.
 - 14. Concessions in tuition fees, free studentships or stipend granted are tenable only on condition of good conduct, regular attendance and satisfactory progress in studies.
 - 15. Students requiring certificates should submit applications with relevant particulars at least one week before the certificates are required. Papers for attestation and railway concession forms for signature should similarly 6e submitted at least one working day before they are required.
 - 16. Students must not enter College office except during the stipulated time, that is, Monday to Friday 10 A.M. to 12.30 P.M.
 - 17. Games, Yogas are compulsory for all students.
 - 18. Attendance in each subject at the general &honours classes and examination are compulsory. No student will be allowed to appear at the College or University Examinations unless she attends 75% of the classes held both general & tutorials in each subject. Parents / Guardians are requested to co-operate with the College Authorities by urging their wards to be regular and punctual in attendance.
 - 19. For library, students will have to pay a fine of Re. 1 per day if they keep books beyond the time limit. They will have to pay Re. 1 per issue of duplicate library card.

- 20. A Caution Money of Rs. 300 shall be payable for the College Library which shall be refundable as the student leaves the College. Application for refund should be submitted to office within six months after it is due.
- 21. A Caution Money of Rs.500 shall be payable by the student according to the rules of the Book Bank Library which shall be refundable within six months as the student leaves the College.
- 22. Caution money will be forfeited if not claimed within two years from the publication of result.
- 23. Guardians will get prior intimation by circular for all excursions / picnics arranged by the College.

8. Duties of the Students

- 1. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a worthy & dignified manner to maintain high academic & moral standards.
- 2. This is the duty of a student to obey the rules & regulations of the College as well as the University regarding Attendance and Examination.
- 3. Students are directed to enroll themselves in the Alumni Association of the College after pass" the 3rd Year University Examination.
- 4. Students should be soberly and modestly dressed while attending the College.
- 5. Every student must carry the Identity Card issued by the College and is required to produce it as and when needed.

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1. Genesis of the Seth Soorajmull Jalan Trust

15th August 1938 opened a new chapter with the formation of the Seth Soorajmull Jalan Trust, a charitable and religious institution which has handed down a legacy of humanitarian services especially in the field of women's education and development. To raise academic standards and to bring cultural integration, equal salience is accorded to all the three languages.



The Students seeking admission in the General Stream BA/B.Com will also have to apply online.

Students seeking admission to the College must note the following:

- a) Applications for admission to First Year B.A. / B.Com course 2018-2019 will be online from the day of declaration of the Class XII / Uchcha Madhyamik / Higher Secondary (West Bengal Board) results.
- b) Admission to BA & B.Com Honours will be on the basis of merit list. Admission /Counselling dates of the applicants will be notified in the Website and College Notice Board.
- c) Selected applicants must attach one recent photograph, one copy photograph of the guardian, age proof certificate and attested Xerox copies of Admit Cards & Mark Sheets of the previous qualifying examination with the Admission Form at the time of taking admission on payment of requisite fees online.
- d) Students coming from other State Boards are required to pay a Migration Fee of Rs. 100 for admission to B.A./B.COM. 1st Year& furnish the office with the information regarding particulars specified in the prescribed form to be had from the College office.
- e) The Students from other States have to submit original Migration certificate.

iv) Rules for Payment of Fees

- a) Fee is to be paid in advance, (half-yearly / semester- wise) online.
- b) Fees once paid cannot be refunded.
- c) Library and other deposits cannot be refunded except at the end of the session.
- d) Before the start of academic session in July every year or semester-wise, the students have to take admission to the 2nd year & 3rd year classes or according to semester respectively. The students should check the notice given in the College website.

Physically challenged (handicapped students) are exempted from University Examination fees @ 40% of the University Examination fees.

Stipend and Freeship: 10% of students are awarded full freeship and half-free studentship. Financially weak students are eligible for this benefit provided they have satisfactory attendance and marks in the 1st Mid Semester examination. Students who wish to avail this facility should apply within 1st to 15th December (2nd Semester) with necessary documents.

V) Academic Calendar

The College encourages every teacher to make a detailed lesson plan to ensure effective class teaching and proper management of time. Every year/Semester before the commencement of classes each department earmarks portions of the syllabus for every teacher. A detailed lesson plan is prepared and academic calendar for each department is published.

The syllabus is normally followed as stated in the teaching plan. If there is any modification, the change is communicated to the students. Every department tries to co-ordinate the recommended lectures per topic and the number of teaching days available in an academic year. Extra classes are arranged according to necessity.

Vi) Attendance:

Regular and punctual attendance is compulsory for every student of the College

as per University of Calcutta regulation:

The class attendance (6 marks for attending 60% or above but less than 75% of the number of lectures delivered; 8 marks for attending 75% or above but less than 90% of the number of lectures delivered; and 10 marks for attending 90% or above of lectures delivered and such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later). Students attending lectures below 60% will be marked 0 (zero).

Rules for Eligibility for University Examination:

- (a) Eligibility shall be decided by the College authority strictly in accordance with the regulations laid down for the purpose.
- (b) Absence from Mid Semester Examination and Test will not be condoned.
- (c) Selection of students for being sent up for University Examinations will be made strictly in accordance with the rules laid down by the College (under directions of the University) as adopted by its Teachers' Council.
- (d) The decision made on the basis of and in accordance with the relevant rules in force shall be final and binding.
- (e) There shall not be any revision or re-consideration except in case where an error of any kind has been detected.
- (f) Exceptional cases will be decided in the promotion meeting and the decision of the Teaching Body will be final.
- (g) Any attempt on the part of the students and / or their parents or guardians to bring any kind of influence or pressure for promotion or for sending up their wards; who have failed to qualify themselves for the same under the rules; will not only affect but will tend to prejudice their cases. However, when a genuine error is detected, the case should be brought to the notice of Teacher-in-Charge / Secretary for enquiry and rectification
- (h) Strict measures shall be taken against students found using "Unfair Means".
- viii) Computerized progress reports showing the marks obtained in the Mid Semester / Mid Term Examination and Test Examination are issued to the students of all the streams

5. Infrastructure & facilities provided by the College

- 4. Class Room: ICT facilitated smart classrooms are available
- 5. **Departmental Seminar Library**: Each Honours Department possesses a seminar library to provide students with text and reference books in addition to the facility provided by the main library.
- 6. **UGC Network Resource Centre**: Funded by UGC, it aims to provide students with internet facilities.
- 7. **Students' Counseling Desk**: Student friendly teachers are always available to sort out specific academic problems as well as for personal & social problems.
- 8. **Personality Test**: Personality Test of the students are arranged by the College through Indian Institute of Psychometry.
- 9. Career Guidance: The College adopts several measures to secure bright future for the students. Teachers involved in the counselling cell provide students with information through different papers like Employment News and brochures sent by different organizations. From time to time, entrepreneurship development programmes and different other training programmes are organized for the benefit of the students.

- 10. **Grievance Redressal Cell**: A grievance redressal cell with complaint box has been set up to look into all types of grievances of students and accept suggestions from teachers, students, guardians & staff for better functioning of the College.
- 11. Legal Literacy Club: To create awareness amongst the students regarding their legal rights.
- 12. **Aquaguard**: Purified drinking water is supplied from aqua guard in each floor and Water Cooler with proper sanitation.

 - 19. **Students' enclave**: It consists of: a) Common room with Table-Tennis Board and other indoor games like badminton, carom boards, etc where the students can spend their leisure time, b) Canteen, the students' food corner.
- 20. **Yoga Centre**: In order to train the students in Yoga & Gymnastics, the College has a center with trained instructor.
- 21. **Academic Tour**: Academic Tours are arranged by several departments as part of their education.
- 22. **Facilities for Physically Challenged**: Self-operative wheel chair for physically challenged is provided and lift/elevator is available.
- 23. **Orientation Programme**: Orientation Programme for the Freshers on their first day of the College is held.
- 24. **Incinerator machine**: Facility of Incinerator and vending machine for sanitary purpose is available.
- 25. **The Annual Function** is held every year. Our enthusiastic students participate in a medley of cultural events under the guidance of the teachers. Students securing 90%

and above in attendance are awarded prizes. Students of B.A./B.Com final year who secure 1st class are awarded Gold Medals.

7. Discipline and Conduct of the College

- 4. Gross misconduct or breach of College discipline, copying or communicating with other students during examination and impersonation at Roll call will be severely dealt with. A student will not be promoted or sent up if she is found using unfair means in the Examination Hall.
- 5. Disfiguring of walls, furniture or any of the properties of the College with writing or in any other manner will be viewed seriously and may result in imposition of fine, suspension from classes or dismissal or expulsion from the College.
 - 6. Students should not leave the class without the permission of the teacher.
- 7. Attendance at the College Examination is compulsory for all students. Promotion or sending up of students for Calcutta University Examinations is determined on the basis of the total marks secured in the different examinations. Medical Certificate is no substitute for attendance.
- 8. No student shall leave the College at any time during the working hours without the permission of the Teacher-in-Charge. Permission will be granted to the student according to the discretion of the Authority.
- 9. Students who remain absent from the College for a month without taking prior permission, will have their names struck off from the Register.
- 10. Attendance at all functions of the College whether on working days or on holidays is compulsory and absence from the same without valid reasons will be strictly dealt with.
- 11. Change of address and telephone numbers must always be notified in writing to the Teacher-in-Charge.
- 12. It is compulsory for the students to attend Assembly and Independence Day, Sports Day, Annual Functions and any other event organized by the College.
- 13. Student must not gather in front of class room before classes are over, nor should they loiter in the corridor when classes are being held.
- 14. Concessions in tuition fees, free studentships or stipend granted are tenable only on condition of good conduct, regular attendance and satisfactory progress in studies.
- 15. Students requiring certificates should submit applications with relevant particulars at least one week before the certificates are required. Papers for attestation and railway concession forms for signature should similarly be submitted at least one working day before they are required.
- 16. Students must not enter College office except during the stipulated time, that is, Monday to Friday 10 A.M. to 12.30 P.M.
- 17. Games and Yoga is also available for all students.

- 18. Parents / Guardians are requested to co-operate with the College Authorities by urging their wards to be regular and punctual in attendance.
- 19. For library, students will have to pay a fine of Re. 1 per day if they keep books beyond the time limit. They will have to pay Re. 1 per issue of duplicate library card.
- 20. A Caution Money of Rs. 300 shall be payable for the College Library which shall be refundable as the student leaves the College. Application for refund should be submitted to office within six months after it is due.
- 21. A Caution Money of Rs.500 shall be payable by the student according to the rules of the Book Bank Library which shall be refundable within six months as the student leaves the College.
- 22. Caution money will be forfeited if not claimed within two years from the publication of result.
- 23. Guardians will get prior intimation by circular for all excursions / picnics arranged by the College.

- 4. Students should be soberly and modestly dressed while attending the College.
- 5. Every student must carry the Identity Card issued by the College and is required to produce it as and when needed.



1. Genesis of the Seth Soorajmull Jalan Trust

15th August 1938 opened a new chapter with the formation of the Seth Soorajmull Jalan Trust, a charitable and religious institution which has handed down a legacy of humanitarian services especially in the field of women's education and development. The Trust was formed under the leadership of Seth Mohanlal Jalan and other prominent members of the society.

The Trust was instrumental in establishing a large number of schools, libraries and reading rooms and Colleges in West Bengal and other parts of India.

History of the College

Seth Soorajmull Jalan Girls' College owes its existence to the great industrialist of Bengal, late Shri Mohanlal Jalan, the founder president of the College. He was a noted industrialist, benevolent social worker and an enthusiastic promoter of Women's Education in Kolkata and in other parts of India. He made his revered father's dream a reality and the College owes its existence to his benevolent vision. Seth Soorajmull Jalan Girls' College had a very modest beginning with a hand full of students at Seth Soorajmull Jalan School at 186, Chittaranjan Avenue, Kolkata - 700 007 on 2nd August, 1954. Today, under the able guidance of the present President of the College, Shri Bharat Kumar Jalan, the College has extended education to girls of all communities. The College has earned a notable cosmopolitan character today and has been totally successful in being one of the notable girls' college in North Kolkata where the medium of instruction is English.

The College has completed its sixty-fifth year. In our pursuit of excellence, the College is assessed and accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). 

iii) Procedure for Admission

Admission to the College is provisional till the registration is confirmed by the University of Calcutta.

Admission procedure commences immediately after the publication of +2 Board results & closes on such date as notified by the College authorities.

Students seeking admission to B.A. / B.Com. Honours will be admitted on the basis of -Merit List after submission of application forms Online as per the" Schedule given by the College Website: www.ssjalangirlscollege.ac.in. The Students seeking admission in the General Stream BA/B.Com will also have to apply online.

Students seeking admission to the College must note the following:

- a) Applications for admission to First Year B.A. / B.Com course 2019-2020 will be online from the day of declaration of the Class XII / Uchcha Madhyamik / Higher Secondary (West Bengal Board) results.
- b) Admission to BA & B.Com Honours will be on the basis of merit list. Admission dates of the applicants will be notified in the Website.
- c) Students coming from other State Boards are required to pay a Migration Fee of Rs. 100 for admission to B.A./B.COM. 1st Year& furnish the office with the information regarding particulars specified in the prescribed form to be had from the College office.
- d) The Students from other States have to submit original Migration certificate.

iv) Rules for Payment of Fees

- a) Fee is to be paid in advance, (half-yearly /semester- wise) to Bank of India, College St. Branch.
- b) Library and other deposits cannot be refunded except at the end of the session.
- c) Before the start of academic session in July every year or semester-wise, the students have to take admission to the 2nd year & 3rd year classes or according to semester respectively. The students should check the notice given in the College Notice Board.

Physically challenged (handicapped students) are exempted from University Examination fees @ 40% of the University Examination fees.

Stipend and Freeship: 10% of students are awarded full freeship and half-free studentship. Financially weak students are eligible for this benefit provided they have satisfactory attendance and marks in the $1^{\rm st}$ Mid Semester examination. Students who wish to avail this facility should apply within $1^{\rm st}$ to $15^{\rm th}$ December ($2^{\rm nd}$ Semester) with necessary documents.

V) Lesson Plan

The College encourages every teacher to make a detailed lesson plan to ensure effective class teaching and proper management of time. Every year/Semester before the commencement of classes each department earmarks portions of the syllabus for every teacher. A detailed lesson plan is prepared and academic calendar for each department is published.

The syllabus is normally followed as stated in the teaching plan. If there is any modification, the change is communicated to the students. Every department tries to co-ordinate the recommended lectures per topic and the number of teaching days available in an academic year. Extra classes are arranged according to necessity.

Vi) Attendance:

Regular and punctual attendance is compulsory for every student of the College

as per University of Calcutta regulation:

The class attendance (6 marks for attending 60% or above but less than 75% of the number of lectures delivered; 8 marks for attending 75% or above but less than 90% of the number of lectures delivered; and 10 marks for attending 90% or above of lectures delivered and such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later). Students attending lectures below 60% will be marked 0 (zero).

Rules for Eligibility for University Examination:

- (a) Eligibility shall be decided by the College authority strictly in accordance with the regulations laid down by the University of Calcutta for the purpose.
- (b) Absence from Mid Semester Examination and Test will not be condoned.
- (c) Selection of students for being sent up for University Examinations will be made strictly in accordance with the rules laid down by the College (under directions of the University) as adopted by its Teachers' Council.
- (d) The decision made on the basis of and in accordance with the relevant rules in force shall be final and binding.
- (e) There shall not be any revision or re-consideration except in case where an error of any kind has been detected.
- (f) Exceptional cases will be decided in the meeting of the Teachers' Council.
- (g) Any attempt on the part of the students and / or their parents or guardians to bring any kind of influence or pressure for promotion or for sending up their wards; who have failed to qualify themselves for the same under the rules; will not only affect but will tend to prejudice their cases. However, when a genuine error is detected, the case should be brought to the notice of Teacher-in-Charge / Secretary for enquiry and rectification
- (h) Strict measures shall be taken against students found using "Unfair Means".
- viii) Computerized progress reports showing the marks obtained in the Mid Semester / Mid Term Examination and Test Examination are issued to the students of all the streams

6. Infrastructure & facilities provided by the College

- 1. **Library:** The College has a well-equipped computerized library consisting of approximately 30,000 books covering all subjects, journals, periodicals, magazines, newspapers adequately to meet the requirement of both students and teachers. The Inflibnet facility is also available. Students can search books through user-terminal and Open Access to library stacks with OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue).
- 2. **Book Bank**: Book Bank facilities are available to the students.
- Reading Room: A large well equipped reading room for students and separate reading room for teachers are there.
- 4. **Class Room**: ICT facilitated smart classrooms are used for teaching.
- 5. **Departmental Seminar Library**: Each Honours Department possesses a seminar library to provide students with text and reference books in addition to the facility provided by the main library.
- 6. **UGC Network Resource Centre**: Funded by UGC, it aims to provide students with internet facilities.
- 7. **Students' Counseling Desk**: Student friendly teachers are always available to sort out specific academic problems as well as for personal & social problems.
- 8. **Personality Test**: Personality Test of the students are arranged by the College through Indian Institute of Psychometry.
- 9. **Career Guidance**: The College adopts several measures to secure bright future for the students. Teachers involved in the counselling cell provide students with information through different papers like Employment News and brochures sent by different organizations. From time to time, entrepreneurship development programmes and different other training programmes are organized for the benefit of the students.

- 10. **Grievance Redressal Cell**: A grievance redressal cell with complaint box has been set up to look into all types of grievances of students and accept suggestions from teachers, students, guardians & staff for better functioning of the College.
- 11. **Legal Literacy Club**: To create awareness amongst the students regarding their legal rights.
- 12. **Aquaguard**: Purified drinking water is supplied from aqua guard in each floor and Water Cooler with proper sanitation.
- 13. **Medical Facility**: A separate Medical Room with provision of first aid is made available to the students. The medical practitioner is attached with the College for any kind of medical problem of the student. The College is associated with The Students' Health Home where a student can do health check —up by paying Rupees 10 per year.
- 14. **Fire Extinguisher**: A few fire extinguishers have been installed on each floor of the college premise as a precautionary measure to deal with any probable calamity caused by fire.
- 15. **College Magazine & Wall Magazine**: To encourage original thought & Expression among students and to make them aware of the recent events of the outside world, the College publishes a printed magazine of its own every year. Also there is provision for wall magazine published by the students.
- 16. **Co and Extra. Curricular Activities**: It covers Inter & Intra-College competitions in Debate, Drama, Elocution, Music, Drawing, Short story, College social, Freshers' Welcome and Farewell Programme are held regularly. Extension programmes like environmental awareness, medical camp, blood donation camp, thalassemia screening camp, AIDS awareness are taken care of every year.
- 17. **Games & Sports**: It opens scope to express the students' ability in sports. Students take part in various Inter-College competitions. Annual sports are held every year.
- 18. **Students' Association**: Every year several students are selected as class representatives. All class representatives together form the students' association. Students' views are expressed through this platform and it works in unison with the teaching and non-teaching staff.
 - 19. **Students' enclave**: It consists of: a) Common room with Table-Tennis Board and other indoor games like badminton, carom boards, etc where the students can spend their leisure time, b) Canteen, the students' food corner.
- 20. **Academic Tour**: Academic Tours are arranged by several departments as part of their education.
- 21. **Facilities for Physically Challenged**: Self-operative wheel chair for physically challenged is provided and lift/elevator is available.
- 22. **Orientation Programme**: Orientation Programme for the Freshers on their first day of the College is held.
- 23. **Incinerator machine**: Facility of Incinerator and vending machine for sanitary purpose is available.
- 24. **The Annual Function** is held every year. Our enthusiastic students participate in a medley of cultural events under the guidance of the teachers. Students securing 90%

and above in attendance are awarded prizes. Students of B.A./B.Com final year who secure 1st class are awarded Gold Medals.

- 6. Some unique features of the College
- Remedial classes for academic redressal of backward students and slow learners.
- 2. Additional care and attention for deserving students.
- 3. Regular tutorial classes for intensive studies.
- 4. Parent Teacher Meet is held every year/ semester for better understanding of students' progress. In addition, parents are called for intimating them about the performance of the students in Mid- Semester examinations and Test examinations.
- 5. Overall evaluation of the College through feedback by parents and students is done.
- 6. Special lectures by persons of eminence are arranged for students.
- 7. UGC sponsored seminars, departmental seminars, as well as special seminars which are conducted by the NSS.
- 8. Active participation of students in civic awareness programme.
- 9. Picnic and Saraswati Puja is organized every year.
- 10. Industry Visit for Commerce Students and audio-visual screenings are held for better teaching- learning process.
- 11. There is scope for scholarships like Kanyashree, National Scholarship Scheme for Minority Students, Swami Vivekananda Merit-Cum-Means Scholarship, Chief Minister Relief Fund (Nabanna) Scholarship, Talent Support Programme (For Minority Girls') West Bengal Minorities Development and Finance Corporation Scholarship for successful and meritorious students.
- 12. **Institutional Membership of Students Health Home, Kolkata:** The College has an institutional membership of the Students Health Home located at 142/2, A.J.C. Bose Road, Kolkata. Medical facilities to students such as free consultation at their polyclinic, medicines, vaccination, pathological tests, X-ray; E.C.G. E.E.G., Endoscopy and other tests, surgery etc. and the treatment at their hospital are provided at a very nominal rate.
- 13. The College is a center for the immunization programme organized by the Kolkata Municipal Corporation.
- 14. NSS: The College runs NSS Wing under University of Calcutta. The College is the Headquarter of District

7. Discipline and Conduct of the College

The College insists on strict discipline and students are expected to follow the rules rigidly. Admission in every case implies an undertaking on the part of the students to conform to the rules and discipline of the College. As per UGC guidelines, the college has an Anti – Ragging and Sexual Harassment Cell. Ragging is prohibited and anyone found guilty is liable to be punished.

1. Mobile Phone: Use of Mobile phone is banned in the class room and

Passages adjoining class rooms. Any violation of this is liable for a fine of Rs: 500 and for feiture of the phone till the fine is paid.

- 2. **Late Attendance**: Late attendance is not acceptable. All the teachers have been authorized to disallow a student from attending a class if the student comes late.
- 3. Identity Card: Identity Card must be carried by students while attending the College and
- 4. Gross misconduct or breach of College discipline, copying or communicating with other students during examination and impersonation at Roll call will be severely dealt with. A student will not be promoted or sent up if she is found using unfair means in the Examination Hall.
- 5. Disfiguring of walls, furniture or any of the properties of the College with writing or in any other manner will be viewed seriously and may result in imposition of fine, suspension from classes or dismissal or expulsion from the College.
 - 6. Students should not leave the class without the permission of the teacher.
- 7. Attendance at the College Examination is compulsory for all students.

 Promotion or sending up of students for Calcutta University Examinations is determined on the basis of the total marks secured in the different examinations. Medical Certificate is no substitute for attendance.
- 8. No student shall leave the College at any time during the working hours without the permission of the Teacher-in-Charge. Permission will be granted to the student according to the discretion of the Authority.
- 9. Students who remain absent from the College for a month without taking prior permission, will have their names struck off from the Register.
- 10. Attendance at all functions of the College whether on working days or on holidays is compulsory and absence from the same without valid reasons will be strictly dealt with.
- 11. Change of address and telephone numbers must always be notified in writing to the Teacher-in-Charge.
- 12. It is compulsory for the students to attend Assembly and Independence Day, Sports Day, Annual Functions and any other event organized by the College.
- 13. Student must not gather in front of class room before classes are over, nor should they loiter in the corridor when classes are being held.
- 14. Concessions in tuition fees, free studentships or stipend granted are tenable only on condition of good conduct, regular attendance and satisfactory progress in studies.
- 15. Students requiring certificates should submit applications with relevant particulars at least one week before the certificates are required. Papers for attestation and railway concession forms for signature should similarly be submitted at least one working day before they are required.
- 16. Students must not enter College office except during the stipulated time.(10 A.M. to 12.30 P.M.)
- 17. Parents / Guardians are requested to co-operate with the College Authorities by urging

their wards to be regular and punctual in attendance.

- 18. For library, students will have to pay a fine of Re. 1 per day if they keep books beyond the time limit. They will have to pay Re. 1 per issue of duplicate library card.
- 19. A Caution Money of Rs. 300 shall be payable for the College Library which shall be refundable as the student leaves the College. Application for refund should be submitted to office within six months after it is due.
- 20. A Caution Money of Rs.500 shall be payable by the student according to the rules of the Book Bank Library which shall be refundable within six months as the student leaves the College.
- 21. Caution money will be forfeited if not claimed within two years from the publication of result.
- 22. Guardians will get prior intimation by circular for all excursions / study tour/ picnics arranged by the College.

8. Duties of the Students

- 1. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a worthy & dignified manner to maintain high academic & moral standards.
- 2. It is the duty of a student to obey the rules & regulations of the College as well as the University, regarding Attendance and Examination.
- 3. Students are directed to enroll themselves in the Alumni Association of the College after passing the 3rd Year University Examination.
- 4. Students should be soberly and modestly dressed while attending the College.
- 5. Every student must carry the Identity Card issued by the College and is required to produce it as and when needed.



To raise academic standards and to bring cultural integration, equal salience is accorded to all the three languages.



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Stipend and Freeship: 10% of students are awarded full freeship and half-free studentship. Financially weak students are eligible for this benefit provided they have satisfactory attendance and marks in the previous Semester Examination. Students who wish to avail this facility should apply within 1st to 15th December with necessary documents.

V) Lesson Plan

The College encourages every teacher to make a detailed lesson plan to ensure effective class teaching and proper management of time. Every year/Semester before the commencement of classes each department earmarks portions of the syllabus for every teacher. A detailed lesson plan is prepared and academic calendar for each department is published.

The syllabus is normally followed as stated in the teaching plan. If there is any modification, the change is communicated to the students. Every department tries to co-ordinate the recommended lectures per topic and the number of teaching days available in an academic year. Extra classes are arranged according to necessity.

vi) Attendance

Regular and punctual attendance is compulsory for every student of the College

as per University of Calcutta regulation.

The class attendance:

- 6 marks for attending 60% or above but less than 75% of the number of lectures delivered in each subject.
- 8 marks for attending 75% or above but less than 90% of the number of lectures delivered in each subject.
- 10 marks for attending 90% or above of lectures delivered in each subject and such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later).
- Students attending lectures in each subject below 60% will not be allowed to sit for Internal Assessment and subsequently will not be allowed in University Examination. Medical certificate is no substitute for attendance.
- (a) Absence from Tutorial and Internal Assessment will not be condoned.
- (b) Selection of students for being sent up for University Examinations will be made strictly in accordance with the rules laid down by the College under direction of University of Calcutta.
- (c) The decision made on the basis of and in accordance with the relevant rules in force shall be final and binding.
- (e) There shall not be any revision or re-consideration except in case where an error of any kind has been detected.
- (f) Any attempt on the part of the students and / or their parents or guardians to bring any kind of influence or pressure for promotion or for sending up their wards; who have failed to qualify themselves for the same under the rules; will not only affect but will tend to prejudice their cases. However, when a genuine error is detected, the case should be brought to the notice of Head of Department/Teacher-in-Charge for enquiry and rectification
- (g) Strict measures shall be taken against students found using "Unfair Means".

4. Parent-Teacher Meet for the students are conducted in the due course of Academic Session, dates of which shall be conveyed later.

5. Infrastructure & facilities provided by the College

- 1. **Library:** The College has a well-equipped computerized library consisting of approximately 32,000 books covering all subjects, journals, periodicals, magazines, newspapers adequately to meet the requirement of both students and teachers. The Inflibnet facility is also available. Students can search books through user-terminal and Open Access to library stacks with OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue).
- 2. Book Bank: Book Bank facilities are available to the students.
- 3. **Reading Room**: A large well equipped reading room for students and separate readingroom for teachers are there.
- 4. Class Room: ICT facilitated smart classrooms are used for teaching.
- 5. **Departmental Seminar Library**: Each Honours Department possesses a seminar library toprovide students with text and reference books in addition to the facility provided by the main library.
- 6. **UGC Network Resource Centre**: Funded by UGC, it aims to provide students withinternet facilities.
- 7. **Students' Counseling Desk**: Student friendly teachers are always available to sort outspecific academic problems as well as for personal & social problems.
- 8. **Personality Test**: Personality Test of the students are arranged by the College through Indian Institute of Psychometric.
- 9. **Career Guidance**: The College adopts several measures to secure bright future for thestudents. Teachers involved in the counseling cell provide students with information through different papers like Employment News and brochures sent by different organizations. From time to time, entrepreneurship development programmes and different other training programmes are organized for the benefit of the students.

- 10. **Grievance Redressal Cell**: A grievance redressal cell with complaint box has been set upto look into all types of grievances of students and accept suggestions from teachers, students, guardians & staff for better functioning of the College.
- 11. **Legal Literacy Club**:The College has a legal Literacy Club to create awareness amongst the students regarding their legal rights.
- 12. **Aquaguard**: Purified drinking water is supplied from aqua guard in each floor and WaterCooler with proper sanitation.
- 13. **Medical Facility**: A separate Medical Room with provision of first aid is made available to thestudents. The medical practitioner is attached with the College for any kind of medical problem of the student. The College is associated with The Students' Health Home where a student can do health check –up by paying Rupees 10 per year.
- 14. **Fire Extinguisher**: A few fire extinguishers have been installed on each floor of the Collegepremise as a precautionary measure to deal with any probable calamity caused by fire.
- 15. **College Magazine & Wall Magazine**: To encourage original thought & Expression amongstudents and to make them aware of the recent events of the outside world, the College publishes a printed magazine of its own every year. Also there is provision for wall magazine published by the students.
- 16. **Co and Extra. Curricular Activities**: It covers Inter & Intra-College competitions in Debate, Drama, Elocution, Music, Drawing, Short story, College social, Freshers' Welcome and Farewell Programme are held regularly. Extension programmes like environmental awareness, medical camp, blood donation camp, thalassemia screening camp, AIDS awareness are taken care of every year.
- 17. **Games & Sports**: It opens scope to express the students' ability in sports. Students take partin various Inter-College competitions. Annual sports are held every year.
- 18. **Students' Association**: Every year several students are selected as class representatives. Allclass representatives together form the students' association. Students' views are expressed through this platform and it works in unison with the teaching and non-teaching staff.
 - 19. **Students' enclave**: It consists of: a) Common room with Table-Tennis Board and otherindoor games like badminton, carom boards, etc where the students can spend their leisure time, b) Canteen, the students' food corner.
- 20. **Academic Tour**: Academic Tours are arranged by several departments as part of their education.
- 21. **Facilities for Physically Challenged**: Self-operative wheel chair for physicallychallenged is provided and lift/elevator is available.
- 22. **Orientation Programme**: Orientation Programme for the Freshers on their first day of the College is held.
- 23.**Incinerator machine**: Facility of Incinerator and vending machine for sanitary purposeis available.
- 24. **The Annual Function** is held every year. Our enthusiastic students participate in amedley of cultural events under the guidance of the teachers. Students securing 90%

and above in attendance are awarded prizes. Students of B.A./B.Com final year who secure 1st class are awarded Medals.

- 12. **Institutional Membership of Students Health Home, Kolkata :**The College has aninstitutional membership of the Students Health Home located at 142/2, A.J.C. Bose Road, Kolkata. Medical facilities to students such as free consultation at their polyclinic, medicines, vaccination, pathological tests, X-ray; E.C.G. E.E.G., Endoscopy and other tests, surgery etc. and the treatment at their hospital are provided at a very nominal rate.
- 13.NSS: The College runs NSS Wing under University of Calcutta. The College is the Headquarter of District.

7. Discipline and Conduct of the College

The College insists on strict discipline and students are expected to follow the rules rigidly. Admission in every case implies an undertaking on the part of the students to conform to the rules and discipline of the College. As per UGC guidelines, the college has an Anti – Ragging and Sexual Harassment Cell. Ragging is prohibited and anyone found guilty is liable to be punished.

- 1. Mobile Phone: Use of Mobile phone is banned in the class room and
 Passages adjoining class rooms. Any violation of this is liable for a fine of
 Rs: 500 and forfeiture of the phone till the fine is paid. In some cases,
 guardian can also be called. The fine so collected is deposited in Student
 - 2. **Late Attendance**: Late attendance is not acceptable. All the teachers have been authorized to disallow a student from attending a class if the student comes late.

- 3. **Identity Card**: Identity Card must be carried by students while attending the College.
- 4. Gross misconduct or breach of College discipline, copying or communicating with other students during examination and impersonation at Roll call will be severely dealt with. A student will not be promoted or sent up if she is found using unfair means in the Examination Hall.
- 5. Disfiguring of walls, furniture or any of the properties of the College with writing or in any other manner will be viewed seriously and may result in imposition of fine, suspension from classes or dismissal or expulsion from the College.
 - 6. Students should not leave the class without the permission of the teacher.
 - 7. No student shall leave the College at any time during the working hours without the permission of the Teacher-in-Charge. Permission will be granted to the student according to the discretion of the Authority.
 - 8. Students who remain absent from the College for a month without taking prior permission, will have their names struck off from the Register.
 - 9. Attendance at all functions of the College whether on working days or on holidays is compulsory and absence from the same without valid reasons will be strictly dealt with.
 - 10. Change of address and telephone numbers must always be notified in writing to the Teacher-in-Charge.
 - 11. It is compulsory for the students to attend Assembly and Independence Day, Sports Day, Annual Functions and any other event organized by the College.
 - 12. Student must not gather in front of class room before classes are over, nor should they loiter in the corridor when classes are being held.
 - 13. Concessions in tuition fees, free studentships or stipend granted are tenable only on condition of good conduct, regular attendance and satisfactory progress in studies.
- 14. Students requiring certificates should submit applications with relevant particulars at least one week before the certificates are required. Papers for attestation and railway concession forms for signature should similarly be submitted at least one working day before they are required.
- 15. Students must not enter College office except during the stipulated time.(10 A.M. to 12.30 P.M.)

16. Parents / Guardians are requested to co-operate with the College Authorities by urging

their wards to be regular and punctual in attendance.

- 17. For library, students will have to pay a fine of Re. 1 per day if they keep books beyond the time limit. They will have to pay Re. 1 per issue of duplicate library card.
- 18. A Caution Money of Rs. 300 shall be payable for the College Library which shall be refundable as the student leaves the College. Application for refund should be submitted to office within six months after it is due.
- 19. A Caution Money of Rs.500 shall be payable by the student according to the rules of the Book Bank Library which shall be refundable within six months as the student leaves the College.
- 20. Caution money will be forfeited if not claimed within two years from the publication of result.
- 21. Guardians will get prior intimation by circular for all excursions / study tour/ picnics arranged by the College.

8. Duties of the Students

- 1. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a worthy & dignified manner to maintain high academic & moral standards.
- 2. It is the duty of a student to obey the rules & regulations of the College as well as the University, regarding Attendance and Examination.



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Stipend and Free-ship: 10% of students are awarded full freeship and half-free studentship. Financially weak students are eligible for this benefit provided they have satisfactory attendance and marks in the previous Semester Examination. Students who wish to avail this facility should apply within 1st to 15th December with necessary documents.

6. Lesson Plan

The College encourages every teacher to make a detailed lesson plan to ensure effective class teaching and proper management of time. Every year/Semester before the commencement of classes each department earmarks portions of the syllabus for every teacher. A detailed lesson plan is prepared and academic calendar for each department is published.

The syllabus is normally followed as stated in the teaching plan. If there is any modification, the change is communicated to the students. Every department tries to co-ordinate the recommended lectures per topic and the number of teaching days available in an academic year. Extra classes are arranged according to necessity.

7. Attendance

Regular and punctual attendance is compulsory for every student of the College as per University of Calcutta regulation.

The class attendance:

- 6 marks for attending 60% or above but less than 75% of the number of lectures delivered in each subject.
- 8 marks for attending 75% or above but less than 90% of the number of lectures delivered in each subject.
- 10 marks for attending 90% or above of lectures delivered in each subject and such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later).
- Students attending lectures in each subject below 60% will not be allowed to sit for Internal Assessment and subsequently will not be allowed in University Examination. Medical certificate is no substitute for attendance.
- (a) Absence from Tutorial and Internal Assessment will not be condoned.
- (b) Selection of students for being sent up for University Examinations will be made strictly in accordance with the rules laid down by the College under direction of University of Calcutta.
- (c) The decision made on the basis of and in accordance with the relevant rules in force shall be final and binding.
- (e) There shall not be any revision or re-consideration except in case where an error of any kind has been detected.
- (f) Any attempt on the part of the students and / or their parents or guardians to bring any kind of influence or pressure for promotion or for sending up their wards; who have failed to qualify themselves for the same under the rules; will not only affect but will tend to prejudice their cases. However, when a genuine error is detected, the case should be brought to the notice of Head of Department/Teacher-in-Charge for enquiry and rectification
- (g) Strict measures shall be taken against students found using "Unfair Means".
- (h) Parent-Teacher Meet for the students is conducted in the due course of Academic Session, dates of which shall be conveyed later.

8. Infrastructure & facilities provided by the College

- 1. **Library:** The College has a well-equipped computerized library consisting of approximately 32,000 books covering all subjects, journals, periodicals, magazines, newspapers adequately to meet the requirement of both students and teachers. The Inflib-net facility is also available. Students can search books through user-terminal and Open Access to library stacks with OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue).
 - 2. **Book Bank**: Book Bank facilities are available to the students.
 - 3. **Reading Room**: A large well equipped reading room for students and separate reading room for teachers are there.
 - 4. **Class Room**: ICT facilitated smart classrooms are used for teaching.
 - 5. **Departmental Seminar Library**: Each Honours Department possesses a seminar library to provide students with text and reference books in addition to the facility provided by the main library.
 - 6. **UGC Network Resource Centre**: Funded by UGC, it aims to provide students with internet facilities.
 - 7. **Students' Counseling Desk**: Student friendly teachers are always available to sort out specific academic problems as well as for personal & social problems.
 - 8. **Personality Test**: Personality Test of the students are arranged by the College through Indian Institute of Psychometric.
 - 9. **Career Guidance**: The College adopts several measures to secure bright future for the students. Teachers involved in the counseling cell provide students with information through different papers like Employment News and brochures sent by different organizations. From time to time, entrepreneurship development programmes and different other training programmes are organized for the benefit of the students.
 - 10. **Grievance Redressal Cell**: A grievance redressal cell with complaint box has been set up to look into all types of grievances of students and accept suggestions from teachers, students, guardians & staff for better functioning of the College.
 - 11. **Legal Literacy Club**: The College has a legal Literacy Club to create awareness amongst the students regarding their legal rights.
 - 12. **Aqua guard**: Purified drinking water is supplied from aqua guard in each floor and Water-Cooler with proper sanitation.
 - 13. **Medical Facility**: A separate Medical Room with provision of first aid is made available to the students. The medical practitioner is attached with the College for any kind of medical problem of the student. The College is associated with The Students' Health Home where a student can do health check –up by paying Rupees 10 per year.
 - 14. **Fire Extinguisher**: A few fire extinguishers have been installed on each floor of the College premise as a precautionary measure to deal with any probable calamity caused by fire.
 - 15. College Magazine & Wall Magazine: To encourage original thought & Expression among students and to make them aware of the recent events of the outside world, the College publishes a printed magazine of its own every year. Also, there is provision for wall magazine published by the students.
 - 16. Co and Extra. Curricular Activities: It covers Inter & Intra-College competitions in Debate, Drama, Elocution, Music, Drawing, Short story, College social, Freshers' Welcome and Farewell Programme are held regularly. Extension programmes like environmental awareness, medical camp, blood donation camp, thalassemia screening camp, AIDS awareness is taken care of every year.
 - 17. **Games & Sports**: It opens scope to express the students' ability in sports. Students take part in various Inter-College competitions. Annual sports are held every year.
 - 18. **Students' Association**: Every year several students are selected as class representatives. All class representatives together form the students' association. Students' views are expressed through this platform and it works in unison with the teaching and non-teaching staff.
 - 19. **Students' enclave**: It consists of: a) Common room with Table-Tennis Board and other indoor games like badminton, carom boards, etc where the students can spend their leisure time, b) Canteen, the students' food corner.

- 20. **Academic Tour**: Academic Tours are arranged by several departments as part of their education.
- 21. **Facilities for Physically Challenged**: Self-operative wheel chair for physically challenged is provided and lift/elevator is available.
- 22. **Orientation Programme**: Orientation Programme for the Freshers on their first day of the College is held.
- 23. **Incinerator machine**: Facility of Incinerator and vending machine for sanitary purpose is available.
- 24. **The Annual Function** is held every year. Our enthusiastic students participate in a medley of cultural events under the guidance of the teachers. Students securing 90%.

9. Some unique features of the College

- 1. Remedial classes for academic redressal of backward students and slow learners.
- 2. Additional care and attention for deserving students.
- 3. Regular tutorial classes for intensive studies.
- 4. Parent Teacher Meet is held every year/ semester for better understanding of students' progress. In addition, parents are called for intimating them about the performance of the students as and when necessary.
- 5. Overall evaluation of the College through feedback by parents and students is done.
- 6. Special lectures by persons of eminence are arranged for students.
- 7. UGC sponsored seminars, departmental seminars.
- 8. Active participation of students in civic awareness programme.
- 9. Picnic and Saraswati Puja is organized every year.
- 10. Audio-visual screenings are held for better teaching- learning process.
- 11. There is scope for scholarships like Kanyashree, National Scholarship Scheme for Minority Students, Swami Vivekananda Merit-Cum-Means Scholarship, Chief Minister Relief Fund (Nabanna) Scholarship, Talent Support Programme (For Minority Girls') West Bengal Minorities Development and Finance Corporation Scholarship for successful and meritorious students.
- 12. **Institutional Membership of Students Health Home, Kolkata:** The College has an institutional membership of the Students Health Home located at 142/2, A.J.C. Bose Road, Kolkata. Medical facilities to students such as free consultation at their polyclinic (for eye, Dental Extraction. Scaling, E.N.T., Surgery, Medicine, skin, Psychiatry, Orthopedics, Gynaenocology, Neurology, Cardiology, Plastic Surgery, Thoracic Surgery, Metabolism, Chest Medicine, Nephrology, Hematology, Urology, Pediatrics, Clinical Oncology and Dermatology), medicines, vaccination, pathological tests, X-ray; E.C.G. E.E.G., Endoscopy and other tests, surgery etc. and the treatment at their hospital are provided at a very nominal rate. 13. NSS: The College runs NSS Wing under University of Calcutta. The College is the Headquarter of District.

10. Discipline and Conduct of the College

The College insists on strict discipline and students are expected to follow the rules rigidly. Admission in every case implies an undertaking on the part of the students to conform to the rules and discipline of the College. As per UGC guidelines, the college has an Anti – Ragging and Sexual Harassment Cell. Ragging is prohibited and anyone found guilty is liable to be punished.

1. Mobile Phone: Use of Mobile phone is banned in the class room and Passages adjoining class rooms. Any violation of this is liable for a fine of Rs: 500 and forfeiture of the phone till the

- fine spaid. In some cases, guardian can also be called. The fine so collected is deposited in Student Association Fund.
- **2.** Late Attendance: Late attendance is not acceptable. All the teachers have been authorized to disallow a student from attending a class if the student comes late.
- **3. Identity Card**: Identity Card must be carried by students while attending the College.
- **4.** Gross misconduct or breach of college discipline, copying or communicating with other students during examination and impersonation at Roll call will be severely dealt with. Astudent will not be promoted or sent up if she is found using unfair means in the ExaminationHall.
- **5.** Disfiguring of walls, furniture or any of the properties of the College with writing or in any other manner will be viewed seriously and may result in imposition of fine, suspension from classes or dismissal or expulsion from the College.
- **6.** Students should not leave the class without the permission of the teacher.
- 7. No student shall leave the College at any time during the working hours without the permission of the Teacher-in-Charge. Permission will be granted to the student according to the discretion of the Authority.
- **8.** Students who remain absent from the College for a month without taking prior permission, will have their names struck off from the Register.
- **9.** Attendance at all functions of the College whether on working days or on holidays is compulsory and absence from the same without valid reasons will be strictly dealt with.
- **10.** Change of address and telephone numbers must always be notified in writing to the Teacher-in-Charge.
- **11.** It is compulsory for the students to attend Assembly and Independence Day, Sports Day, Annual Functions and any other event organized by the College.
- **12.** Student must not gather in front of class room before classes are over, nor should they loiter in the corridor when classes are being held.
- **13.** Concessions in tuition fees, free studentships or stipend granted are tenable only on condition of good conduct, regular attendance and satisfactory progress in studies.
- **14.** Students requiring certificates should submit applications with relevant particulars at least one week before the certificates are required. Papers for attestation and railway concession forms for signature should similarly be submitted at least one working day before they are required.
- **15.** Students must not enter College office except during the stipulated time. (10 A.M. to 12.30 P.M.).
- **16.** Parents / Guardians are requested to co-operate with the College Authorities by urging their wards to be regular and punctual in attendance.
- **17.** For library, students will have to pay a fine of Re. 1 per day if they keep books beyond the time limit. They will have to pay Re. 1 per issue of duplicate library card.
- **18.** A Caution Money of Rs. 300 shall be payable for the College Library which shall be refundable as the student leaves the College. Application for refund should be submitted to office within six months after it is due.
- **19.** A Caution Money of Rs.500 shall be payable by the student according to the rules of the Book Bank Library which shall be refundable within six months as the student leaves the College.
- **20.** For Caution money will be forfeited if not claimed within two years from the publication of result.
- 21. Guardians will get prior intimation by circular for all excursions / study tour/ picnics

arranged by the College.

11. Duties of the Students

- A. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a worthy & dignified manner to maintain high academic & moral standards.
- B. It is the duty of a student to obey the rules & regulations of the College as well as the University, regarding Attendance and Examination.
- C. Students are directed to enroll themselves in the Alumni Association of the College after passing the 3rd Year University Examination.
- D. Students should be soberly and modestly dressed while attending the College.
- E. Every student must carry the Identity Card issued by the College and is required to produce it as and when needed.
